










As a kid, Walter was interested in marine biology. He started tide pooling in the early 70s. While studying marine biology at UCSB in the late 70's, he did a senior project tagging tidepool sculpins and mapping their distribution between tides. Fast forward two decades, Walter joins SDUPS and discovers nikonos cameras with extension tubes. Many days were spent trying to get those tidepool subjects to hold still in those framers. The advent of point and shoot digital cameras was a game changer and the images vastly improved. Many of a Sunday was spent tidepooling with the family by OB pier followed by super nachos at the cafe on the pier. Over the years, Walter has learned the



pools and how to get good images without getting wet.

Additionally, he has walked tidepools from San Diego up to Fort Bragg. As for fame, Walter is an advanced photographer with SDUPS. His images have been published in a few magazines and books, mostly shark images. Some of his tidepool images have been published in Milton Love's fish books, probably because no one else takes pictures of tidepool fish.

SDUPS October 23rd Meeting

The October SDUPS General Meeting was attended by about 28 people in person and 5 on the online Zoom. Our President **James Logan** got the meeting underway by welcoming members and guest.

James moved the meeting agenda around a little by introducing our evenings guest speaker to be the first part of the meeting. **Domenic Biagini** is the founder of "Gone Whale Watching" out of Mission Bay. Domenic told his story about what happen to him to be so attracted to the ocean at an early age. His love of the ocean has lead him into his business and also becoming a renowned wildlife photographer. He started off his presentation with a fabulous 5 minute video of dolphins being chased and attacked by a pod of orcas. The cinematography was fabulous and exciting to watch. One of the points that Domenic made about making videos in todays tech days, is that equipment that cost thousands of dollars years ago, can be purchased at a fraction of the cost and enable the photographer to capture stunning results. He also shared that making a great video is about story telling and how it should be done. There was a question and answer period at the end of his presentation that gave us all information needed to produce impressive videos. Thank you Domenic for a great and entertaining presentation. Also a special thank you to our Vice-President, Paula Selby for setting the presentation up.

We then took our intermission with those wonderful snacks from **Cindy Lipthay**.

The meeting reconvened with the October Competition winners.

Known for capturing rare whale behavior and dramatic marine moments with drones and cinema-grade gear, Domenic bridges the gap between scientific storytelling and visual impact.






SDUPS Library Show In "LaJolla Living" Magazine

BECOME A BETTER UNDERWATER PHOTOGRAPHER! Underwater photography is a learned skill. So, you might as well learn from the best, an excellent photographer that is also an excellent teacher. Your instructor, Marty Snyderman, is that person.

When taking classes from Marty, you will receive one-on-one instruction as you review your images, discuss ways to improve your underwater photography, refine the techniques you are using, and learn new techniques, concepts, and skills that will help you create the photographs you want to make. The sessions center around techniques and are not tied to any particular make, model, or type of camera or camera system that can be used to make still photographs underwater.

Sharing a session with Marty is also a great way to re-fresh your photography skills before your next diving vacation. If you only get to dive a few times a year, during your next trip you are likely to spend a few days relearning and refreshing your skills. A session or two with Marty before your trip can turn the frustration and lost time from having to relearn into fun dives and pleasing photographs.

How It All Works The one-on-one program is completely customizable to your knowledge, skill level, and personal goals. Marty will use Zoom software to work with you. He has licensed a version of the software that enables the two of you to keep the sessions private.

During each session, Marty will share his expertise and help you gain a better understanding of various factors involved in underwater photography, and he will suggest techniques for you to employ that can help you improve your underwater photography. Each session can be up to 60 minutes long. The cost for a session is \$65.00 U.S. Any additional time that you will not be not charged for is provided at Marty's discretion or through the purchase of another session.


