Take a Deep Dive into Coral Conservation

Dear members, though most aquarium staff are sheltering in place, our aquarists have been working hard caring for our animals. They have been split into two teams that do not overlap, are practicing social distancing, and wearing protective equipment as they care for creatures and continue conservation programs.

Birch Aquarium has been propagating coral for more than 20 years. These corals are used in our exhibits and shared with other Association of Zoos and Aquarium (AZA) facilities around the country. We also assist coral researchers at Scripps Institution of Oceanography, UC San Diego, and beyond.

In our latest video, Aquarist Sean takes us behind the scenes to show how we care for an endangered Staghorn Coral. Learn about the fragile process of fragmenting the coral into smaller sections and growing new colonies below.









Dottybacks - Pseudochromidae: These small, elongated, and

often brightly colored, crevice-dwellers only venture into the open momentarily from their cryptic hiding palces inside the reef's structure, The color of dottybacks is often variable within a species, which is frequently believed to relate to an individual's sex. Their diet consists of small crustaceans including zooplankton and polychaete worms. Sex reversal appears to be a common family trait. Females lay adhesive egg masses, which are guarded and regularly picked up in the mouths of the males to mix and aerate.

The image to the right is a **Magenta Dottyback**. Their size is to 7 cm (2 3/4 in). The bright Magenta color gives this fish its common name. A solitary fish or sometimes found in loosely scattered groups. They are usually found

at the base of steep drop-offs or in caves and crevices in steep slopes and coastal and outer reefs in depths of 5 to 40 m, usually below 15 m. The Magenta is found in the Western Pacific: S.W. Japan, Philippines, Palau, Papua New Guinea to Samoa.

There is a **Royal Dottyback** which the front half is magenta and the back have is yellow. The Royal is found in N.W. Australia, E. Indonesia, Papua New Guinea and the Solomon Islands.

Also with this same color pattern is the **Flame Dottyback**. It is overall magenta in color with a yellow snout and forehead. It is

localized in Indonesia, know only from Cenderawash Bay, in Papua Province (W. New Guinea).


In the reference book that I used of this information, "Reef Fish Identitication" Tropical Pacific, they list thirty-three different Dottyback species.

It amazes me how beautiful and colorful these little fish are, and how localized they can be. Certain species found in one area but not in another. For me it's always

a joy to be able to add another Dottyback to my collection of different fish images.

- 1. All entries should be limited to 5 minutes long, not including titles or credits where underwater footage is not used. Absolute length including titles and credits may not exceed 5 minutes 30 seconds.
- 2. A Minimum of 50% of the footage must have been taken underwater.
- 3. Videos/images should not show deliberate harassment of the marine creatures unless this harassment is the ecological point of the video.
- 4. Please ensure that you have all rights to any media that is used in you presentation (s) such as music, visual footage, personal, copyright, or any other legal rights.
- 5. Files can be in the following formats: ProShow, .mov, mp4, mp2.
- **April 5th will be the deadline to submit film for the festival. Submissions can be brought to the March 26 SDUPS meeting on DVD/thumb drive or sent via dropbox to uwmike@att.net. Any questions can be directed to the same email address.




