





#### Member Profile: Herb Gruenhagen



The day I moved to San Diego in 1974, I looked out the window and saw a guy about my age unloading a SCUBA tank from his car. Little did I suspect that **Herb Gruenhagen** and I would know each other and still be friends forty-six years later! Herb is one of the nicest people I know and one of the most dedicated underwater photographers, who continues to share what he knows with others.

Herb Gruenhagen began his SCUBA experience in a NASDS SCUBA class with his dad in 1966 in northern California (Napa) and completed his certification in 1968. Herb was drawn to diving due to his interest in the underwater animals, a curiosity sparked by his high school biology teacher. Herb has been a very active diver ever since, and continued his SCUBA certifications through Dive Master certification in 2005.

Herb has been involved in underwater photography since the 1970's, starting with a Nikonos 2 underwater film camera. In the 1980's he was shooting a Nikonos 3, in the 1990's he was using a Tussey housing containing a Nikon film camera 8008s, and later spent a few years shooting video with a Gates housing and a Sony DCR VX1000. Herb is presently using a Fantasea housing with a Canon G16 and really likes the modular system for flexibility of formats and the ability to change format underwater on the same dive.

When asked about his favorite subjects to photograph, Herb says he really likes octopus and nudibranchs. Not surprisingly, his favorite memory involves watching an octopus work attempting to remove a lobster out of a cage by removing the lobster legs, pieces at a time, in order to return to its den. The octopus was unsuccessful in getting himself and his prize from the cage, but the octopus had lunch anyway in the cage. This was an excellent living example of the octopus advanced intellect and problem solving skills.

Herb's continued interest in marine biology has grown into teaching REEF marine biology classes for the past six years. He alternately teaches classes in fish and invertebrate identification, and approximately 500 students have completed his REEF classes.

Herb's advice to developing underwater photographers is to "practice, practice, practice", and then take a class if you want to further improve your skills as well as learn new ones.

Herb joined the San Diego Underwater Photographic Society in 1985, and served as the SDUPS President for five years from 2003 through 2008. Subsequently, Herb served on the Board of Directors of the San Diego Oceans Foundation.

Herb still dives every Wednesday, Friday, and Sunday mornings. I don't think I know anyone who knows more about the life and topography of La Jolla Shores than Herb. If a member wishes to make a truly enjoyable dive at the Shores, ask Herb if you can join him for a dive! I can't think of a nicer guy with whom to share the underwater world at the Shores!

Giant Clams - *Tridacna* is a genus of large saltwater clams, marine bivalve mollusks in the subfamily Tridacninae, the giant clams. They have heavy shells, fluted with 4 to 6 folds.

The mantle is brightly colored. They inhabit shallow waters of coral reefs in warm seas of the <u>Indo-Pacific</u> region. These clams are popular in <u>marine aquaria</u>, and in some areas, such as the Philippines, members of the genus are farmed for the marine aquarium trade. They live in symbiosis with photosynthetic algae (zooxanthellae). Some species are eaten by humans.

#### Anatomy

Compared to other clams, the soft mantle that secretes the shell is greatly expanded. The clams even have small lens-like structures called ocelli through which light penetrates

#### **Ecology and behavior**

Tridacna clams are common inhabitants of Indo-Pacific coral

reef benthic communities in shallower waters. They live in symbiosis with

photosynthetic dinoflagellate algae that grow in the mantle tissues. Light penetrates the mantle through small lens-like structures called ocelli. They are sessile in adulthood. By day, the clams spread out their mantle so that the algae receive the sunlight they need to photosynthesize, whereas the color pigments protect the clam against excessive light and UV radiation. Adult clams get most (70-100%) of their nutrients from the algae and the rest from filter feeding. When disturbed, the clam closes its shell. The popular opinion that they pose danger to divers who get trapped or injured between the closing sharpedged shell is not very real, as the closing reaction is quite slow. Their large size and easy accessibility has caused overfishing and collapse of the natural stocks in many places and extirpation in some of the species. They are being sustainably




farmed in some areas, both for the seafood market in some Asian countries and for

the aquarium trade.

Tridacna clams can produce large white pearls with an undulating, porcelainlike surface, which may be described as "non-nacreous pearls". The "Pearl of Lao Tzu", also known as the "Pearl of Allah", is the world's largest pearl weighing 6.4 kilograms; it was said to have been found inside a Tridacna by a Filipino diver in 1934.





How It All Works The one-on-one program is completely customizable to your knowledge, skill level, and personal goals. Marty will use Zoom software to work with you. He has licensed a version of the software that enables the two of you to keep the sessions private.

During each session, Marty will share his expertise and help you gain a better understanding of various factors involved in underwater photography, and he will suggest techniques for you to employ that can help you improve your underwater photography. Each session can be up to 60 minutes long. The cost for a session is \$65.00 U.S. Any additional time that you will not be not charged for is provided at Marty's discretion or through the purchase of another session.




