

Critter Corner

The **sixbar angelfish** (*Pomacanthus sexstriatus*), also known as the **six banded angelfish**, is a marine angelfish belonging to the family Pomacanthidae.

Distribution

This species in native to the western Pacific Ocean. It is present in Australia, Cambodia, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, Micronesia, Myanmar, New Caledonia, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Solomon Islands, Taiwan, Thailand, Vanuatu, and Viet Nam.

Habitat

This species commonly occurs in South Pacific reefs, most commonly in the Great Barrier Reef of Australia's northeast coast, at depths of 3 to 60 m. It inhabits coastal, lagoon and outer reef slopes in clear water, with a preference for coral-rich areas.

Description

Pomacanthus sexstriatus can reach a total body length of about 46 cm (18 in) in the ocean. These angelfishes have 13 -14 dorsal spines, 18-23 dorsal soft rays, 3 anal spines and 18-19 anal soft rays. They have an easily recognizable very dark brown head. Body may have a yellow, silver white or cream coloration with black or brown vertical stripes (usually six on each side, hence the common name six bar and the species name sexstriatus). There is one white vertical stripe on each side of its head. Fluorescent blue spots speckle the entire body, fins and tail. On the top and bottom fin and tail are present fluorescent blue lines.

Like many juvenile angelfish, also the juveniles of this species have a pattern of white and light blue horizontal stripes on a dark blue background. The adult coloring is formed when they reach a length of 8–15 cm (3.1–5.9 in).

Biology and Behavior

The six-banded angelfish is often seen in pairs, as it mates with one partner and they stay together for life. These tropical marine reef-associated fishes are omnivore, eating worms, mollusks, and tunicates, sponges, corals and algae, and they are also known to eat other fishes' eggs. Adults prefer areas with rich coral growth. The



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SDUPS Member Profile - Mike Poirier

When you receive your Goby each month, in its typical state of perfection, have you ever wondered how long it took to create it, or how long it took to learn to put the whole thing together? **Mike Poirier** has been creating our monthly Goby newsletters every month for 16 years! What a gift to the SDUPS starting in 2006!

Mike Poirier began SCUBA diving in 1963 while he was in high school in the chilly waters of the state of Mine. He initially was a spear fisherman. He took a break from diving while serving in the Navy and raising a family. He eventually resumed diving and began taking underwater photographs while vacationing in Hawaii, using disposable film cameras to capture images of colorful fish, eels, and turtles in the clear waters. Mike joined the SDUPS in 2004 and upgraded his camera gear to a Nikonos V for four years, and then to a Canon point and shoot digital camera. Mike presently shoots a Sony NEX5 digital in a Nauticam housing. Mike's favorite subjects to shoot are frogfish and macro subjects.

Mike's favorite memory centers around a trip he took to Tubbataha in the Philippines while diving with his friend and SDUPS member, **Pete Fowler**. Mike, Pete and the guide were separated from the group and were visited by a friendly whale shark that hung around with them for at least 20 minutes, swimming back and forth between Pete and Mike. When they finally had to surface, the whale shark followed them up to the chase boat. Mike and Pete have taken tropical dive trips every year except two, since 2005.

When I asked Mike what advice he would give to newer members and photographers, he replied that they should join SDUPS, pay attention, and don't be afraid to ask lots of questions of fellow members. We are all here to share.

In 2006 Mike received the SDUPS Service Award as well as the Novice photographer of the Year. In 2007 he earned the Amateur Photographer of the Year. Mike received SDUPS Service Awards again in 2011 and 2015, and earned the Advanced Photographer of the Year in 2012. Mike has served as Vice President of the SDUPS for two years, President for four years, editor of the Goby for the past SIXTEEN YEARS, and presently serves as a Director on the club Board of Directors.

When I returned to the SDUPS after a long absence, I was new to digital photography and equipment. I was able to ask Mike for advice and found that he is open to answering member's questions, a really attentive listener, and responds with thoughtful and insightful answers. I really appreciated his help.

We are fortunate to have Mike's involvement and expertise in the SDUPS. If you haven't met him in person, make sure to find him at a meeting and say HI!






Photo Classes

Sharing a session with Marty is also a great way to re-fresh your photography skills before your next diving vacation. If you only get to dive a few times a year, during your next trip you are likely to spend a few days relearning and refreshing your skills. A session or two with Marty before your trip can turn the frustration and lost time from having to relearn into fun dives and pleasing photographs.

How It All Works The one-on-one program is completely customizable to your knowledge, skill level, and personal goals. Marty will use Zoom software to work with you. He has licensed a version of the software that enables the two of you to keep the sessions private.

During each session, Marty will share his expertise and help you gain a better understanding of various factors involved in underwater photography, and he will suggest techniques for you to employ that can help you improve your underwater photography. Each session can be up to 60 minutes long. The cost for a session is \$65.00 U.S. Any additional time that you will not be not charged for is provided at Marty's discretion or through the purchase of another session.




