





SDUPS Member Profile - Greg Volger

Many years ago I was at the Diving locker in Pacific Beach getting some tanks filled and got to talking to another diver. He shared that he had a Zodiac inflatable boat, liked to take underwater photographs, and was getting ready to head down to Baja. I also had a Zodiac, liked to shoot underwater, and was also preparing to go to Baja. **Greg Volger** and I shared many trips after that and I enjoyed the friendship of a truly outstanding diver and underwater photographer.

Greg began SCUBA diving in 1975 in Santa Barbara, California. In 1979, one of his friends brought a Nikonos III underwater camera back from Japan and Greg started shooting underw photos. According to Greg, he liked taking pictures more than taking abalone.

Greg joined the San Diego Underwater Photographic Society in the very early 1980s and entered the competitions with his images on transparencies. His photographs earned votes and acclaim and Greg won Novice of the year in one of his first years. Soon after, Greg published an article about elephant seals in Sea Frontiers Magazine. Greg took a hiatus from the UPS while he and his sife Sue raised a family and Greg was working, but subsequently returned and has been active in UPS ever since

Greg loves to travel for diving and has visited Baja, Vancouver Island, Belize, Roatan, Guanaja, Hamneidet Norway, four islands in Hawaii, Guadalupe Island, Costa Rica, Cocos Islands, Galapagos, Vanuatu, Solomon Islands, Wakatobi, Bali, Florida Keys and springs, Puerto Piramides (Argentina), East Timor, a variety of locations in Indonesia, Chanaral de Acetuno, Chile, Palau, and various locations along the California coast. Wow!

His favorite dive locations are Raja Ampat in Indonesia for beautiful coral reefs and fishes, Cocos Islands for hammerhead and whale sharks, Wakatobi for beautiful reefs, Puerto Piramides, Argentina for Southern Right Whales, and Palau for sharks. Greg mentioned that he has visited most of those places in the past five years. His favorite subjects are big things, like Pacific White sided dolphins, mantas, and big sharks.

Greg says that one of his favorite memories in underwater photography is being in Palau and being in the middle of 20 - 30 mantas as they were feeding.

After his first Nikonos III camera, Greg had a variety of underwater film and digital cameras. He presently shoots a Nikon D850 in a Nexus housing with four Sea and Sea YSD 2 and 3 strobes.

When asked about advice that he would share with divers who wish to improve their photography, Greg said to go wherever the water is warm. If a diver wants to shoot wide angle, skip SCUBA and free dive the subject and get close. He also recommends that when shooting macro, be careful to point the strobes slightly outside the subject.

Greg Volger serves as a director on the SDUPS board. Among other things, Greg

records the accumulated points that members earn each year toward moving up from one division the next.

Greg has earned Novice of the Year, Amateur of the Year, and Advanced Photographer of the year His photographs have also won awards in various competitions and been displayed at the Del Mar Fair.

If members wish to travel to warm water locations, ask Greg what destinations he has recommends That is how I will be planning my travels in the future!

Each session can be up to 60 minutes long. The cost for a session is \$65.00 U.S. Any additional time that you will not be not charged for is provided at Marty's discretion or through the purchase of another session.




