
#### SDUPS October 28th Meeting

Our SDUPS October Meeting was well attended with approximately twenty five in person members and guests and with about three on the Zoom part of the meeting. Yes it was called a hybrid meeting. Our president **Amy** is trying her best to make our monthly meeting available both in person and on Zoom for people who can't make the meeting for some reason or another. There are still a few kinks to be worked out but it's coming along very well.

Amy then welcomed a few guests and talked about our photo show at the La Jolla Library coming up soon. (see story on page 9). Then it was on the to the showing of the October Competition winners. A thank you to **Kris Carner** for putting that together.

We took a short intermission for snacks and catching up with friends and swapping dive stories. Thank you to **Jackie Patay** for providing the refreshments. Your help is very much appreciated.

After the break, Amy introduced our guest speaker for the evening, Doctor Ian Grover (see last months Goby for his bio) who is an emergency medical physician with the hyperbaric chambers at UCSD. Ian talked about the two chambers in San Diego County. One in Hillcrest and the other in Encinitas. He made a point in telling us that the one in Encinitas is for wound care only and not for dive related treatment. Ian's presentation included the resources available to the diving community and also dive safety measures we can practice. He gave a little history on the hillcrest chamber that was put into operation in 1985. This chamber is used for both wound and dive related treatment. UCSD also trains technicians in Hyperbaric Medicine. In talking about dive safety, Ian pointed out that it's important to find out if a chamber is available if your are traveling to a remote location. Due to money constraints, many chambers around the world are shutting down. Dive insurance was stressed as being very im-




portant. Some of the other subjects that Ian touched upon were: breath hold diving, aviation decompression sickness, Arterial Gas Embolism and COVIB-19 and diving. He also mentioned that most diving accidents are in two categories. Older divers run into trouble with heart problems and with younger divers it's panic. Both avoidable with medical check-ups and training. Ian closed his talk with providing us with the Dive Medicine Clinic phone number 619-471-9210 which is available to answer questions related to diving. Thank you Doctor Grover for a very interesting and informative presentation.

Being close to nine and with all business taken care of, Amy closed the meeting thanking everyone who attended.

This is our last event for the year. It will be a fun time to celebrate the Holiday's and be with fellow SDUPS members. Hope to see you all there.





#### Critter Corner

**Spiny waspfish**, Ablabys taenianotus, also know as the Spiny Cockatoo waspfish, or Spiny Leaf Fish, is a small fish species that belongs to the scorpionfishes family Scorpaenidae

#### **Description**

This fish can be up to 6 inches (15 cm) in length. The body compressed laterally, endowed with a dorsal fin starting from the top of the head until joining practically the superior base of the caudal fin. When the dorsal fin is

spread, it looks like a crest resembling the one on a cockatoo. The thorns of the dorsal fin are venomous. This fish mostly stays on the substratum and moves by means of its pectoral fins. Its color varies from cream to dark brown, with irregular spots.

#### **Distribution and Habitat**

This species occurs in the tropical West Pacific Ocean, from Malaysia to Japan and from Indonesia to Australia. Ablabys taenianotus lives at depths from 2 to 60 ft (1 to 18 m) on sandy, silty or rubble bottoms, and also in fields of sea grass.

#### **Behavior**

This species is benthic and nocturnal. It is an opportunistic predator and ambushes passing prey while mimicking a crumpled, dead leaf or a drifting piece of seaweed. It allows itself to drift with the moving water in the way that an inert object would do. It may be found singly or in pairs. The fish feeds on small shrimp and other tiny crustaceans that pass near its mouth.

#### Note

Waspfish can be distinguished from the Leaf Fish that belongs to the Scorpionfish family, by the Dorsal Fins that begin above or in the front of the eyes. Most species sway back and forth to mimic debris as they wait for their victims to venture close. The above image was taken in Lembeh Strait.

#### Rare "cotton candy lobster" caught in Maine

A lobsterman made the catch of a lifetime off the coast of Maine last weekend. **Bill Coppersmith** trapped a 1-in-100 million iridescent lobster, also known as a "cotton candy" lobster.

Coppersmith has been fishing for 40 years but has never had a catch like the one he made in Casco Bay. He named it Haddie, after his granddaughter. Haddie will not end up on a plate — right now the crustacean is hanging out in a tank at Get Maine Lobster in Portland until a permanent home at an aquarium can be found.

The color change is the result of a rare genetic mutation that is not considered helpful to the lobster because they aren't able to blend in with their environment.



How It All Works The one-on-one program is completely customizable to your knowledge, skill level, and personal goals. Marty will use Zoom software to work with you. He has licensed a version of the software that enables the two of you to keep the sessions private.

During each session, Marty will share his expertise and help you gain a better understanding of various factors involved in underwater photography, and he will suggest techniques for you to employ that can help you improve your underwater photography. Each session can be up to 60 minutes long. The cost for a session is \$65.00 U.S. Any additional time that you will not be not charged for is provided at Marty's discretion or through the purchase of another session.


