
President's Message

CLUB NOTES

As always, the SDUPS Board of Directors is trying to improve the general meetings. We've had some great presentations in the past but many feel we are getting away for the clubs main theme of helping all members become better underwater photographers. It is suggested that we need more technical/teaching U/W photographic presentations. This would be helpful to new comers as well as seasoned photographers.

This means that we have to look within the membership and also outside of the membership to find photographers who can put together a short presentation along these lines.

Below are examples of some of the topics that would make for great presentation for many members:

There are many, many "technical" subjects that are relating directly to our underwater photography members. Each can be shared at a different depth.

Some examples:

- O. Choice of Camera lenses
- O. Cameras: TG6, Gopro, 3/4, full-frames, etc.
- O. Mounting of camera and lighting equipment
- O. Setting of F-stops, shuttle speed
- O. Iso settings, and other camera settings vs the results
- O. Use of lights on different situations
- O. Light brightness, colors, color depth, etc.
- O. Choice of colors combinations
- O. Positioning of light(s) vs situations
- O. Macros vs. Wide-angle shots
- O. Post production on stills and on videos
- O. How to prepare a video for competition
- O. And, for stills
- O. Psychological reasons: what do people want to see.
- O. Subjects choices
- O. Subject Posing or not
- O. Travel skills
- O. Self critique of shots: videos and stills.
- O. How to publish and where.
- O. Reasons for joining SDUPS!!

"Turn on your cylinder, and then close it one-quarter turn." Many divers have heard this instruction during and after their scuba certification classes. Have you ever wondered why this procedure was recommended? Is this practice still necessary?

In the past, valve designs were not as sophisticated as they are today. Overtightening older valves could cause damage in two ways. When forced beyond fully open, a seal inside the valve near the handwheel, called the valve stem seal or packing, would become damaged over time from being squeezed against the valve bonnet nut. Divers feared that the valve would

stick open and delay any ability to shut it off in an emergency. The second cause of damage was from closing the valve too tightly, which could affect a different seal located at the end of the handwheel's inner part, called the valve seal or insert, by pressing it onto the seat.


In both cases the valve would start to leak either through the handwheel or out of the valve outlet. To compensate for the leak, divers would close the valve even more tightly, which would cause an even greater leak over time.

Modern valve design, however, protects both the valve stem seal and valve seat. Less force is needed to fully close or open the valve, and valves are now less prone to leaking or sticking open. While the quarter-turn-back practice is still present in other industries to prevent valve damage and ensure that valves do not stick open, the dive industry is moving away from this practice because people unfortunately keep getting injured. BECOME A BETTER UNDERWATER PHOTOGRAPHER! Underwater photography is a learned skill. So, you might as well learn from the best, an excellent photographer that is also an excellent teacher. Your instructor, Marty Snyderman, is that person.

When taking classes from Marty, you will receive one-on-one instruction as you review your images, discuss ways to improve your underwater photography, refine the techniques you are using, and learn new techniques, concepts, and skills that will help you create the photographs you want to make. The sessions center around techniques and are not tied to any particular make, model, or type of camera or camera system that can be used to make still photographs underwater.

Sharing a session with Marty is also a great way to re-fresh your photography skills before your next diving vacation. If you only get to dive a few times a year, during your next trip you are likely to spend a few days relearning and refreshing your skills. A session or two with Marty before your trip can turn the frustration and lost time from having to relearn into fun dives and pleasing photographs.

How It All Works The one-on-one program is completely customizable to your knowledge, skill level, and personal goals. Marty will use Zoom software to work with you. He has licensed a version of the software that enables the two of you to keep the sessions private.

During each session, Marty will share his expertise and help you gain a better understanding of various factors involved in underwater photography, and he will suggest techniques for you to employ that can help you improve your underwater photography. Each session can be up to 60 minutes long. The cost for a session is \$65.00 U.S. Any additional time that you will not be not charged for is provided at Marty's discretion or through the purchase of another session.


