



Presenting on June 24, 2025 8:00 pm at Sumner Auditorium Scripps Campus








Paula Selby will be joining Stephen Frink via Zoom while on a photographic expedition with him in La Paz, Mexico. Stephen will talk about the evolution of his career in underwater photography and will share several photos published in Alert Diver magazine and other public venues. Stephen is among the world's most frequently published UW photographers, with a career spanning four decades. He arrived in Key Largo in 1978 (where he first met Paula Selby) to open a small studio dedicated to UW photo services, primarily renting cameras and processing E-6 slide film, but he soon began to receive assignments to photograph and write articles for the consumer dive publications of the day. He worked as a photojournalist for Skin Diver magazine for 17-years, covering much of the Caribbean, Bahamas, and Florida Keys for the publication. Subsequently he worked as the Director of Photography for Scuba Diving magazine. For the past 10 years Stephen has been the publisher of Alert Diver Magazine, a beautiful coffee-table collectible magazine for the members of the Divers Alert Network. https://stephenfrink.com/about/






SDUPS at the La Jolla Library














SDUPS General Meeting May 22nd

A beautiful warm San Diego evening with good surfing waves made for some tight parking for the May SDUPS meeting at Sumner Auditorium. Never the less, about fifteen members showed up for what was a special presentation.

President James Logan got the meeting underway and explained because of the type of meeting we were having, why it was impracticable to make it a Zoom meeting also. For this meeting James had invited members to showcase their camera rigs and share there story about how they got involved with underwater photography and how they progressed in updating their equipment. It was very interesting because of the different cameras and accessories that were shown. Each person talked about their early days of U/W photography and why they are using the camera they presently own. Most everyone shared that the type of photography they like the most, dictates the type of camera used. Some shoot macro exclusively, others wide angle, and others mostly shoot video. One member for example, Walter Heim, is a shark shooter and his rig is set up especially for that. Some of the setups were simple point-and-shoot systems whereas others were massive dome port heavy systems. We would like to thank the half dozen or so members who hauled their gear down to the meeting.

As always, **Cindy Lipthay** provided some delicious snacks for our intermission. This provided time for a lot of talk and questions about the different camera setups.

Last on the agenda for the evening was going over the May competition results. The theme, "Dominant Color" provided some very interesting and beautiful images.

BECOME A BETTER UNDERWATER PHOTOGRAPHER! Underwater photography is a learned skill. So, you might as well learn from the best, an excellent photographer that is also an excellent teacher. Your instructor, Marty Snyderman, is that person.

When taking classes from Marty, you will receive one-on-one instruction as you review your images, discuss ways to improve your underwater photography, refine the techniques you are using, and learn new techniques, concepts, and skills that will help you create the photographs you want to make. The sessions center around techniques and are not tied to any particular make, model, or type of camera or camera system that can be used to make still photographs underwater.

Sharing a session with Marty is also a great way to re-fresh your photography skills before your next diving vacation. If you only get to dive a few times a year, during your next trip you are likely to spend a few days relearning and refreshing your skills. A session or two with Marty before your trip can turn the frustration and lost time from having to relearn into fun dives and pleasing photographs.

How It All Works The one-on-one program is completely customizable to your knowledge, skill level, and personal goals. Marty will use Zoom software to work with you. He has licensed a version of the software that enables the two of you to keep the sessions private.

During each session, Marty will share his expertise and help you gain a better understanding of various factors involved in underwater photography, and he will suggest techniques for you to employ that can help you improve your underwater photography. Each session can be up to 60 minutes long. The cost for a session is \$65.00 U.S. Any additional time that you will not be not charged for is provided at Marty's discretion or through the purchase of another session.


